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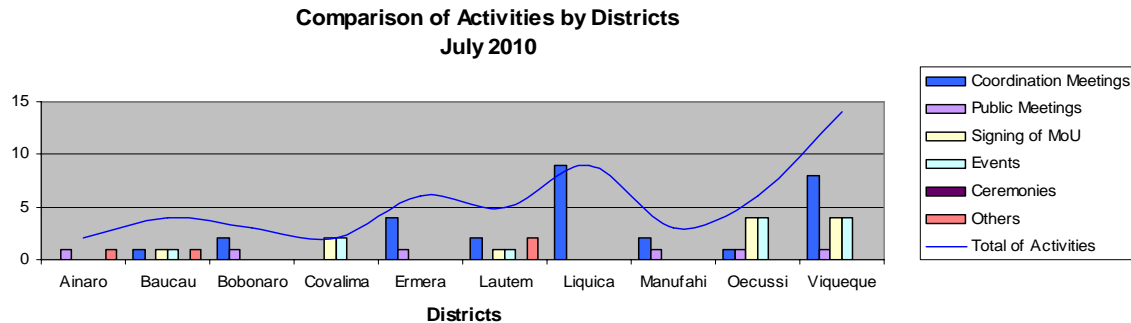

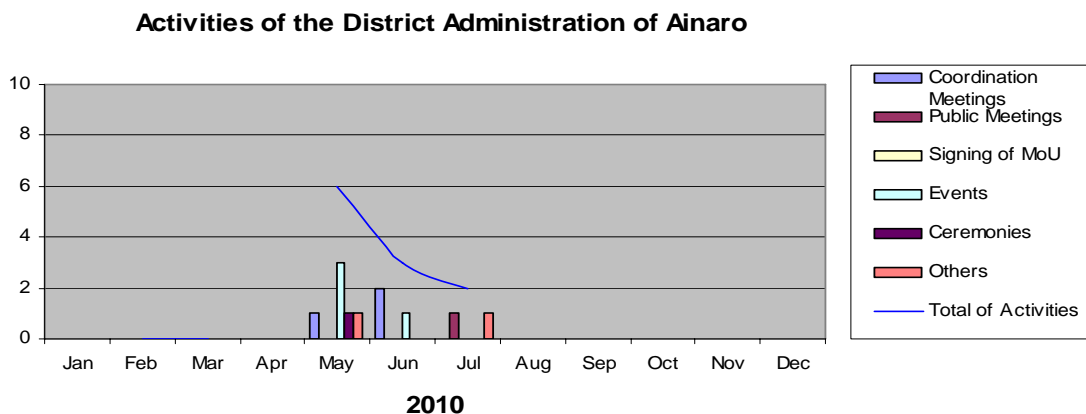

## July 2010

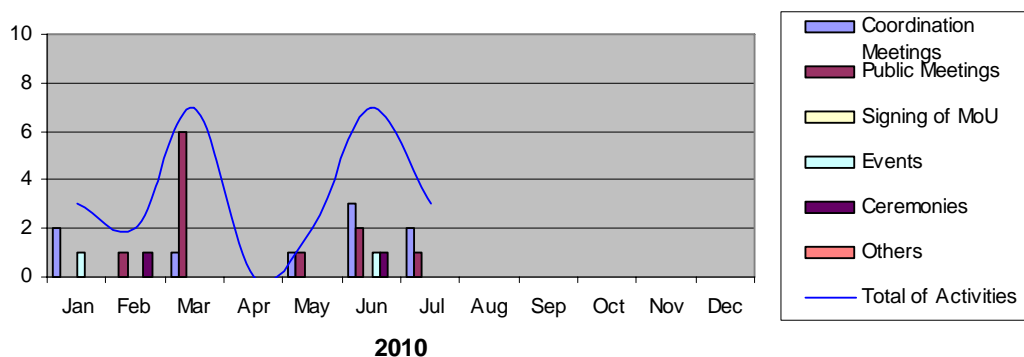

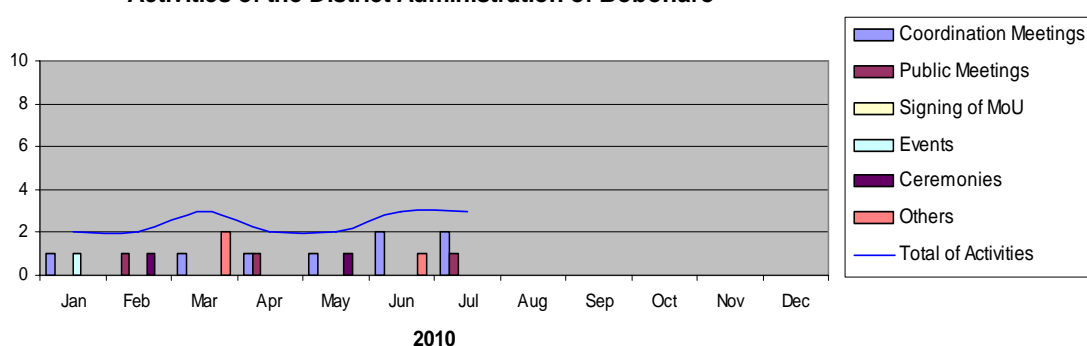

## July 2010

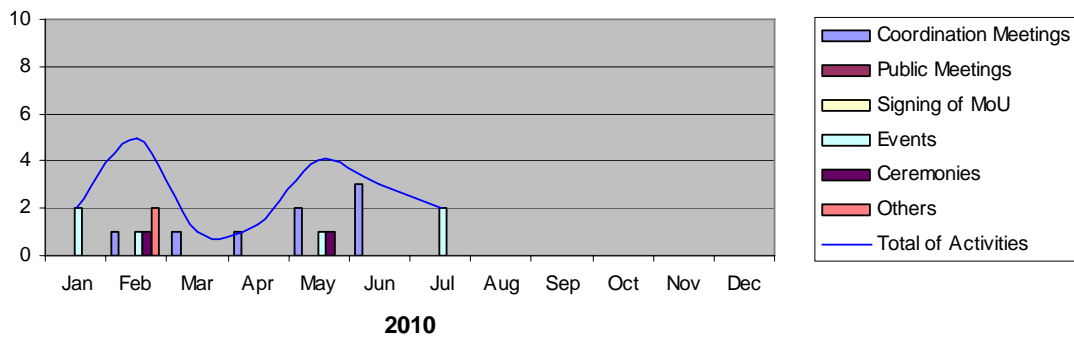

2. On 26 July 2010, District Administration Office facilitated a training program for Sucos supported National Directorate for Support to Suco Administration Suco in the district.

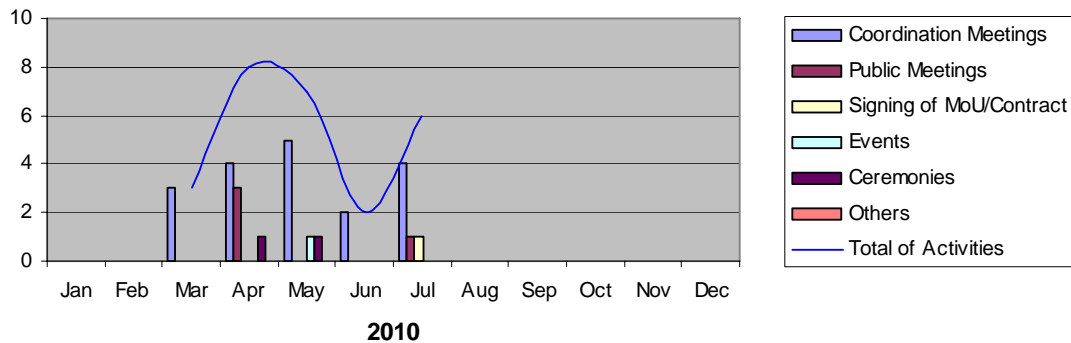

### July 2010

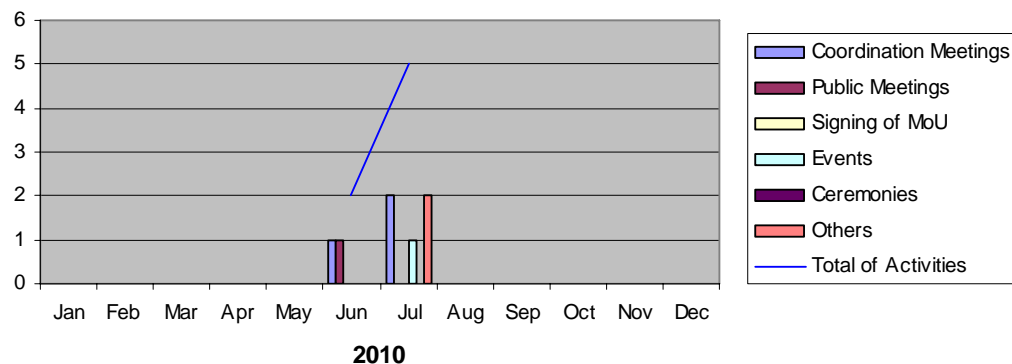
1. From 12-16 July 2010, the District Administration successfully organized facilities and arrangements for the district visit of Prime Minister on community consultations regarding National Strategic Development Plan.
2. On 20 July 2010, the district joint team organized a meeting with Director of National Directorate for Local Development and Territorial Planning (DNDLOT) regarding final selection procedure of 57 short listed contractors who will execute infrastructure projects under Decentralized Development Package. The meeting was attended by Director of DNDLOT, District Administrator, District Development Officer; sub-district Administrator, Heads of district offices, project teams of Local Development Program and Decentralized Development Package.
3. On 22 July 2010, the District Administrator organized a coordination meeting with district joint team in the district. The agenda discussed in the meeting were related to contract offer and contract signing, publishing the construction design, estimated bill of quantities and construction site visits in sub-districts where the construction companies are located. The meeting was attended by about 35 participants and they were national task force team, deputy-district Administrator, District Development Officer, concerned heads of district offices, team of Decentralized Development Package and 21 selected contractors.
4. From 26-27 July 2010, District Administrator (DA) attended a coordination meeting at UNDP in Dili, regarding development programme for selected areas in district. Later in the district, the District Administrator debriefed about the program to district staff.
5. On 27 July 2010, deputy-district Administrator (DDA) attended a meeting on community health organized by International NGO SHARE in Dili. After returning to the district the DDA debriefed about the program to the District Administration.
6. On 30 July 2010, the District Administrator as a coordinator of district joint team organized a coordination meeting in district Administration Hall regarding tender award and contract signing with 21 qualified construction companies who will execute Decentralized Development Package projects in sub-districts. The meeting was attended by National Task Force Team, District Administration staff, other staff from District Offices including related construction companies.

### July 2010

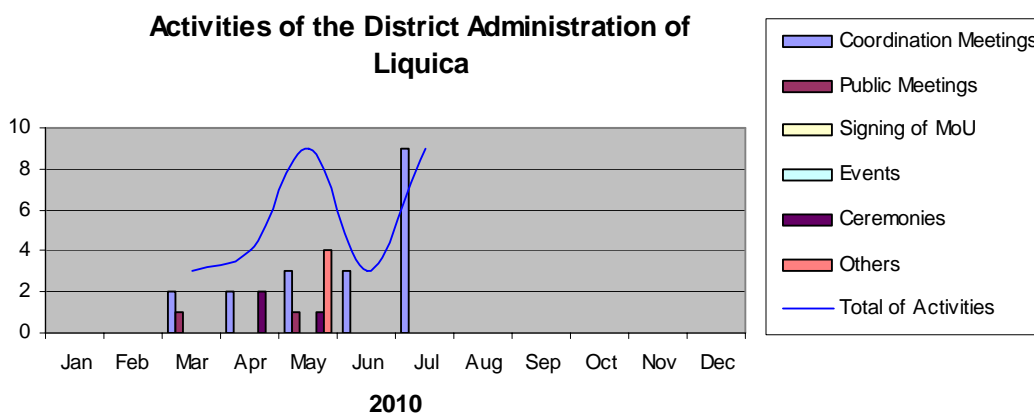
- On 19 July 2010, District Administrator organized a coordination meeting with the heads of all district offices (government line agencies) including sub-district Administrators, and Community Development Officers to review LDP.
- On 26 July 2010, District Administrator organized a coordination meeting with the heads of all district offices including sub-district Administrators, and Community Development Officers to prepare for emergency support for floodings. DA reminded the district staff to be more discipline at their works. DA informed that there will be a uniform for the staff which is the same as the staff of Ministry of State administration and Territorial Management with logo if the ministry.
- On 26 – 28 July 2010, District Administration Office opened distribution of tender documents of the five projects under LDP. The projects are installation of solar panel system, 2 small bridges construction works, clean water rehabilitation, road leveling, construction of retaining wall for erosion protection.
- On 28 July 2010, the construction companies submitted tender document with their bill of quantities to construct projects under LDP-first phase. The meeting identified 36 construction companies have bid for tender for five projects. There are still two projects remaining that are waiting for re-tendering; as there were not adequate companies applied for tender bidding for these two projects.  
The total tendered projects were: erosion protection project (11 companies), cage vaccination construction (8 companies), Sanitation (6 companies), multiplication dam (5 companies) and barrier and water channel construction (6 companies).
- On 30 - 31 July 2010, the District Joint Team of Local Development Program visited local development projects' sites in Suco Ililai (project on solar panel system), Suco Fuiloro (2

projects on small bridges construction), Suco Home (project on clean water rehabilitation), Suco Fuiloro-Aldeia Be'e Moris (project on road leveling), sub-district Lautem (project on erosion protection for the safety of market building).

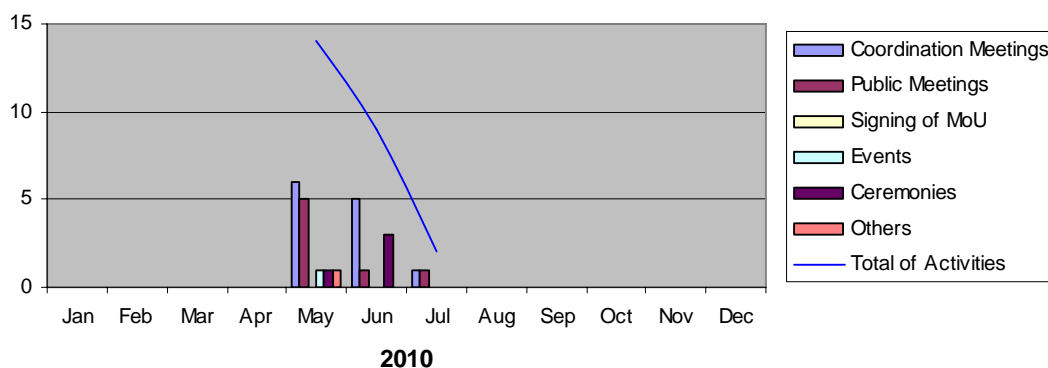

2. On 28 July 2010, District Administrator organized a consultative meeting with representatives from Secretary of State for Vocational Training and Employment, district

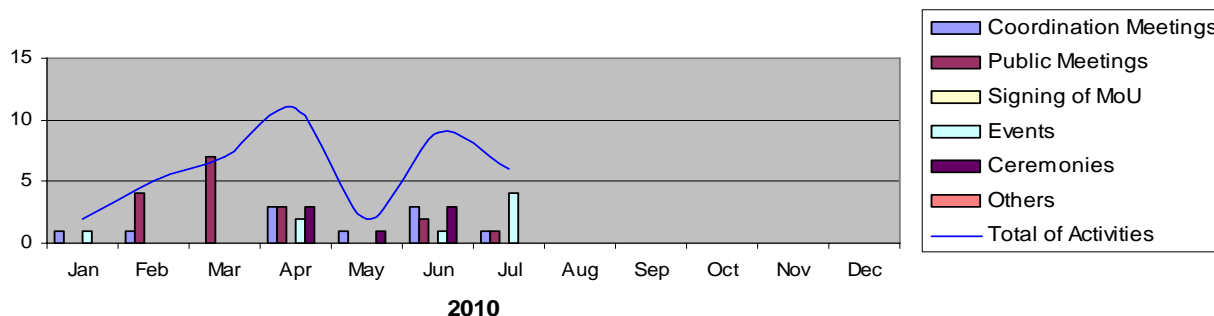

### Activities of the District Administration of Oecusse



### July 2010

1. On 01 July 2010, District Statistics Office organized a meeting to inform about the forthcoming national census that has the program to collect population data by visiting every household in Sucos. After the meeting there was a training program for technical staff involved in the national census.
2. On 09 July 2010, National Directorate for Local Development and Territorial Planning organized three-day workshop on Suco Development Plan. All Suco Chiefs and their Administrative Assistants, and all sub-district Administrators of Oecusse were present in the workshop. The objective was to train 18 Suco Chiefs, 18 Suco Administrative Assistants and 4 sub-district Administrators on how to prepare socio-economic investment plan of each Suco.
3. On 22 July 2010, Ministry of Justice organized a meeting to inform district staff on human rights law related to land and property and civil cases in the court.

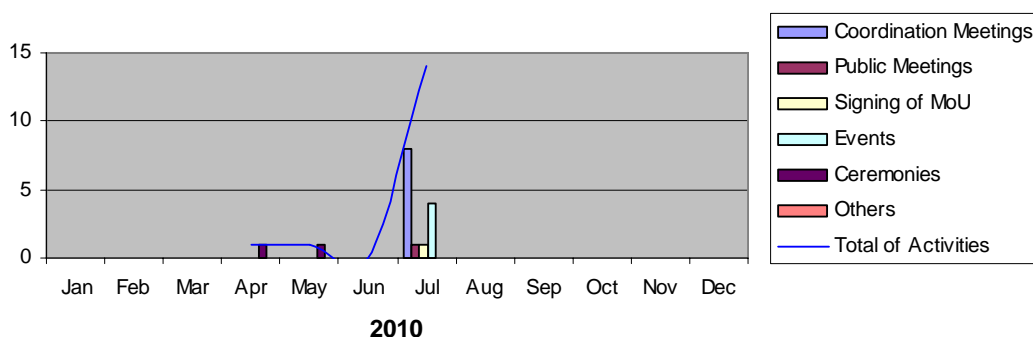
4. On 19 July 2010, district Administrator organized a meeting with district joint committee regarding procurement process of Decentralized Development Package (DDP). The discussion of meeting was focused on the selected companies that would soon start executing the infrastructure projects under DDP.
5. On 20 July 2010, deputy-District Administrator organized a meeting with interne (students from university) who arrived in Oecusse to do field study for two weeks. The 450 students from National University of Timor-Leste are sent to every Sucos in the district to help in identifying Suco's main issues and to find out potential solutions to address those issues. The students will work with Suco authorities, key informants and local population.
6. On 28 July 2010, National Directorate for Conflict Prevention and Security Management organized an interaction program on community conflict prevention. About 80 people attended the program including Aldeia Chiefs, Suco Chiefs, district Administration staff, district line agency staff and police. The interaction program aimed to raise awareness of local authorities to prevent conflict rather than to cure.

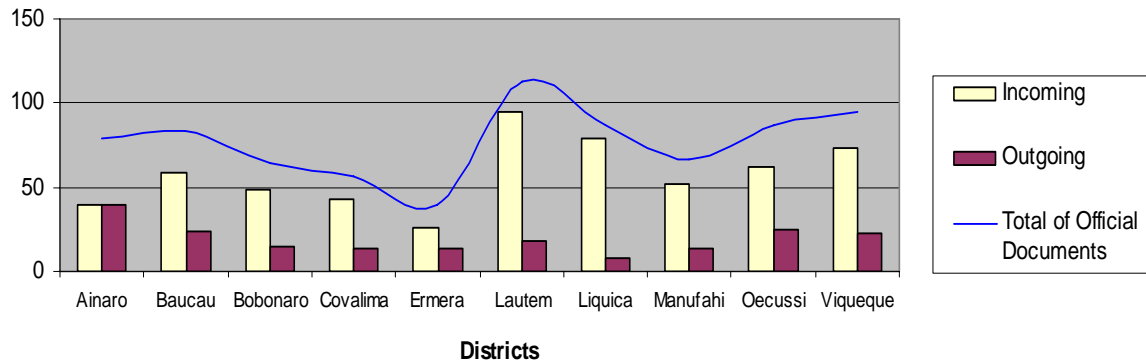
### July 2010

9. On 19 July 2010, District Administrator organized staff meeting regarding daily operation of office and administrative issues.
10. On 23 July 2010, District Administrator participated in the opening day of training program on food and nutrition in sub-district Ossu.
11. On 25 July 2010, District Administrator signed contract with 11 companies that will execute infrastructure projects in sub-districts under Decentralized Development Package.

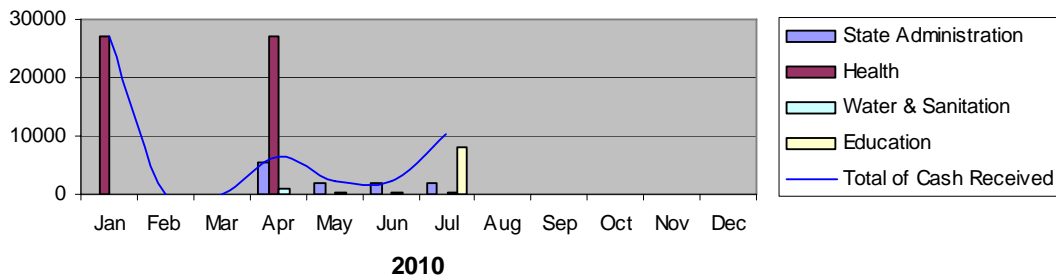

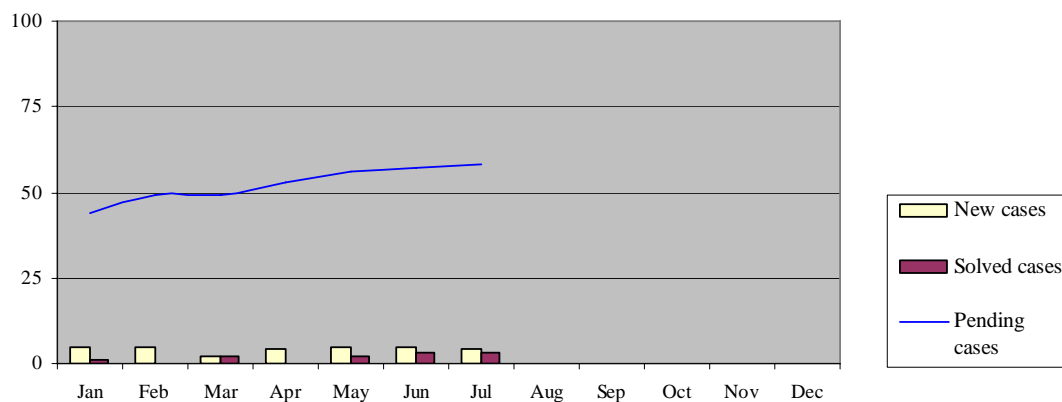

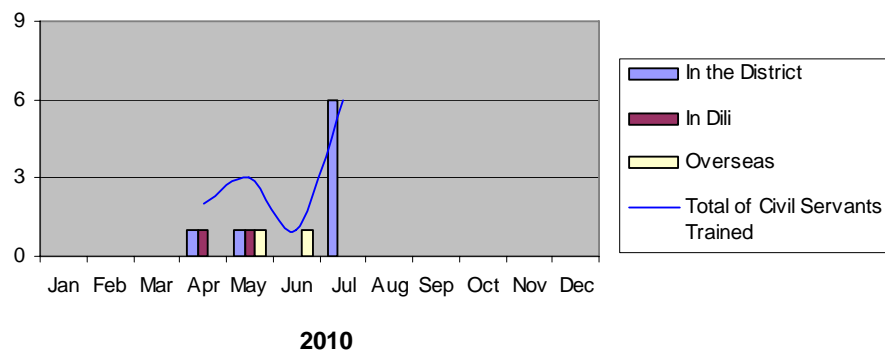

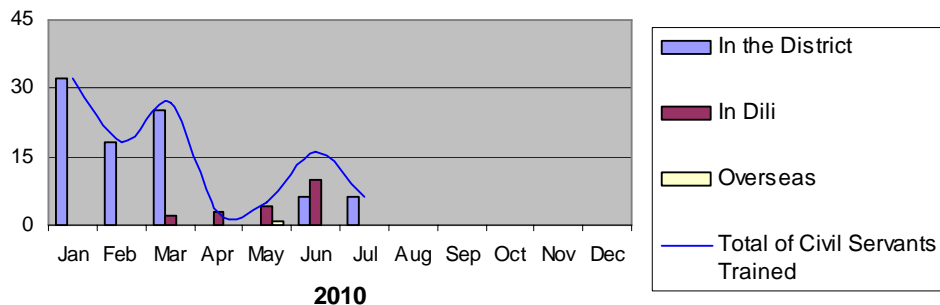

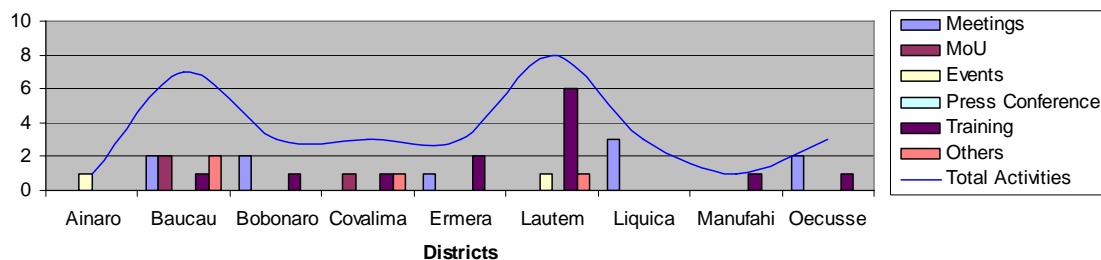

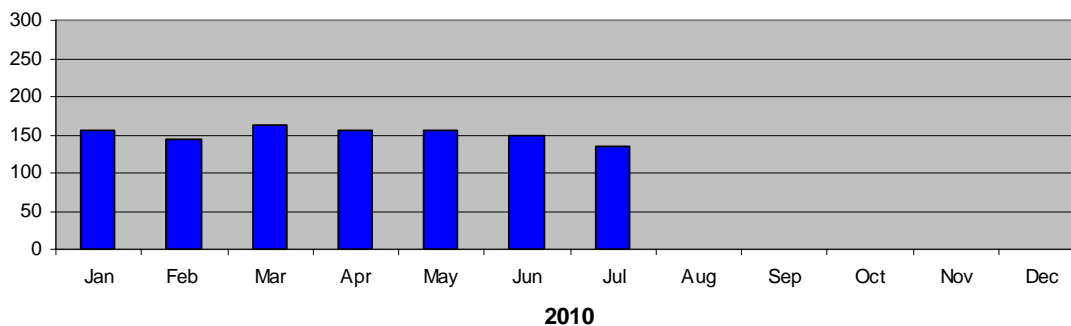

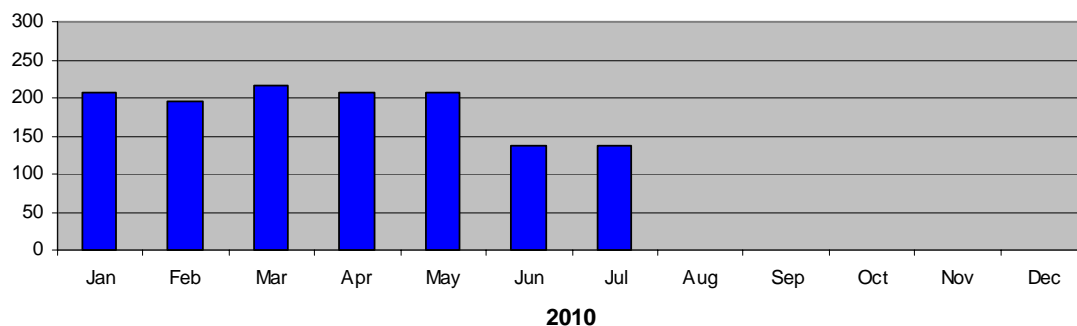

## Timor-Leste Demographic Profile by District

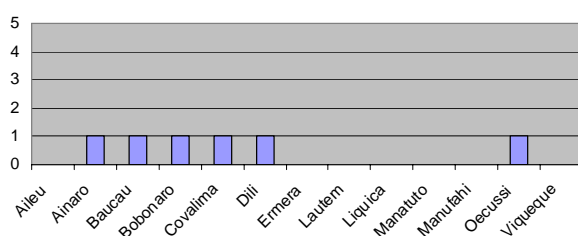

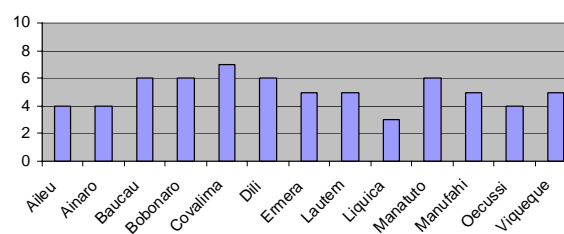

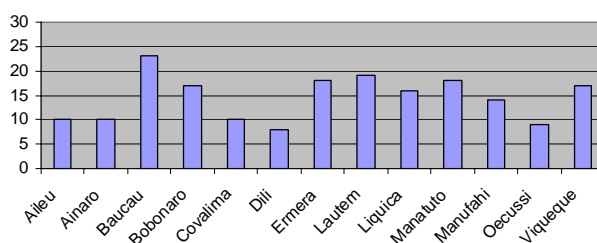
Public Hospitals by District



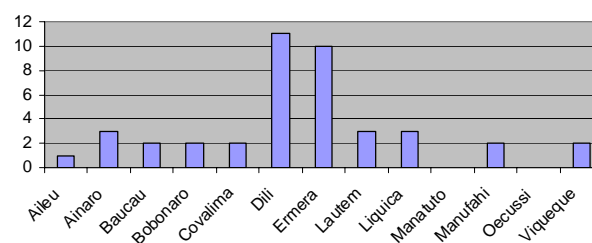
Community Health Centres by District



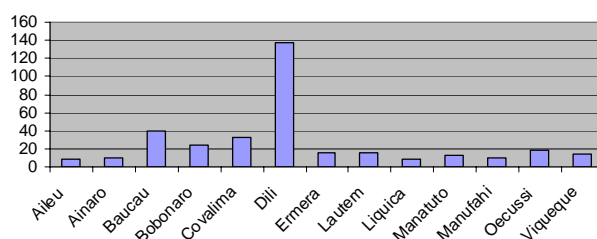
Health Posts by Districts



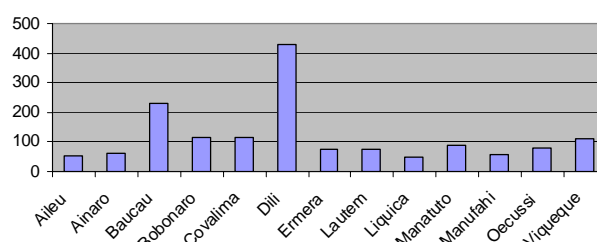
Private Clinics by District

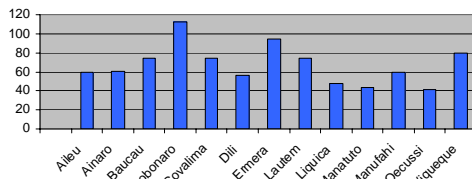

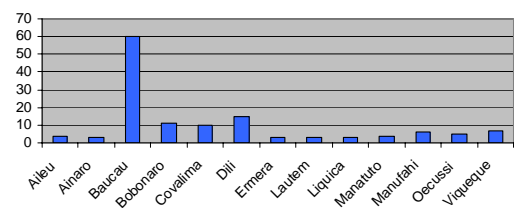

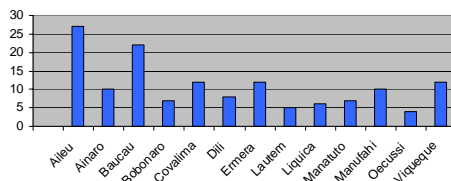
Number of Primary Schools per District



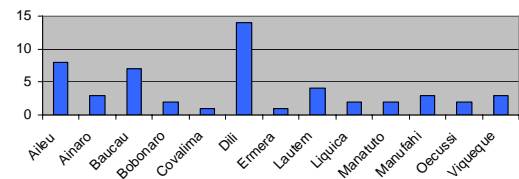
Number of private Primary Schools per District



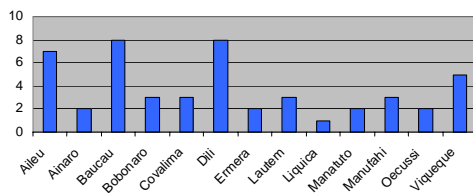
Number of Pre-Secondary Schools per District



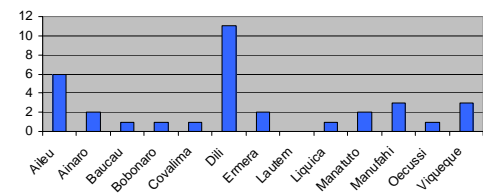
Number of Pre- Private Secondary Schools per District

## Annex 04: 2010 Budget Allocations for the Local Development Programme- Ministry of State Administration and Territorial Management

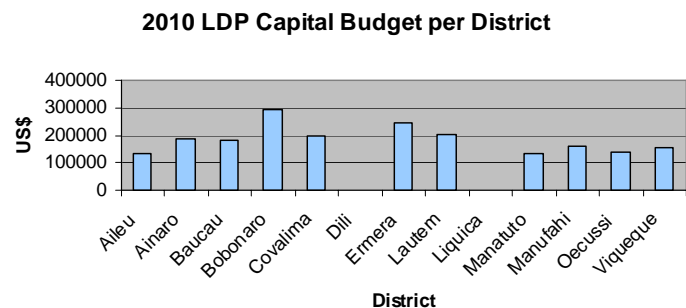
The Local Development Programme (LDP) is a pilot programme that is testing decentralization models in order to establish a local governance system that is effective, transparent and responsive to community needs, with the support of UNCDF, UNDP, Norwegian Embassy and Irish Aid.

The LDP pilot was gradually established in order to provide lessons based on practical experience that will help in the national debate about decentralization. In order to test different possibilities for decentralization, the Ministry of State Administration and Territorial Management (MSATM) begun piloting two models of local governance. The first pilot model began in Bobonaro in 2005 and has since expanded to Lautem, Aileu and Manatuto. A second pilot model started in 2008 in the districts of Baucau, Ainaro, Manufahi and Covalima. In 2010, five new districts were incorporated in the LDP as Dili, Ermera, Liquica, Oecussi and Viqueque, totalizing the 13 Districts throughout the territory.

The LDP is implemented through the Local Development Fund (LDF) that is allocated to the local Assemblies, which are composed of Suco Council representatives and district officers. These Assemblies will be able to use this fund to finance activities and small-scale infrastructure projects, such as clinics or health posts, school buildings, water and sanitation, irrigation, that have a direct impact on the communities. In 2009 the LDP implemented 127 projects in the eight pilot districts in various areas and provided a series of training at district level to members of the local Assemblies.

### Voter Registration 2010 Results

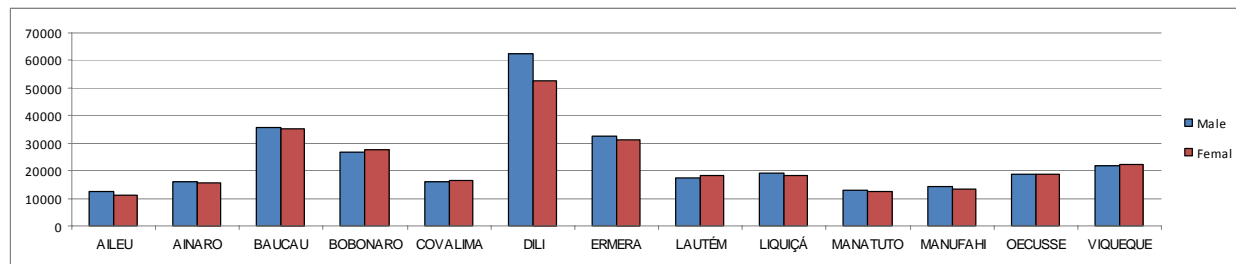
Together with the launching of the 2009 Community Elections Women Participation Booklet, on the 5th July STAE presented the official final results of the Voter Registration 2010 and Electoral Database (ADB) update. The results were signed on June 28th in STAE HQ in Dili, together with CNE, District administrators and PNTL. The process was conducted into six different phases, each one covering specific districts, after the conclusion of the process; the total number of voters' registered in the country is 599.465, which represents an increase of approximately 11.000 new voters' after the Suco Elections occurred in 2009. Over the total number of voters', 50.96% (305.472) are male and 49.04% (293.993) female, being the districts of Dili (54.20% - 45.80%), Aileu (52.41% - 47.59%) and Manufahi (51.59% - 48.41%) the districts with the largest male participation, and Lautém (51.49% - 48.51%), Viqueque (50.73% - 49.27%) and Bobonaro (50.70% - 49.30%), the districts with largest female participation.

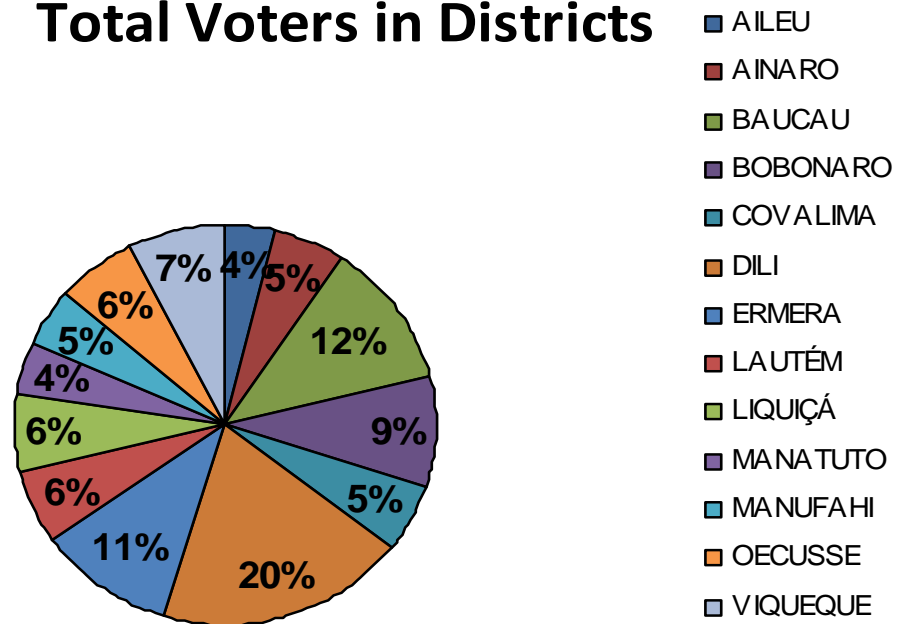

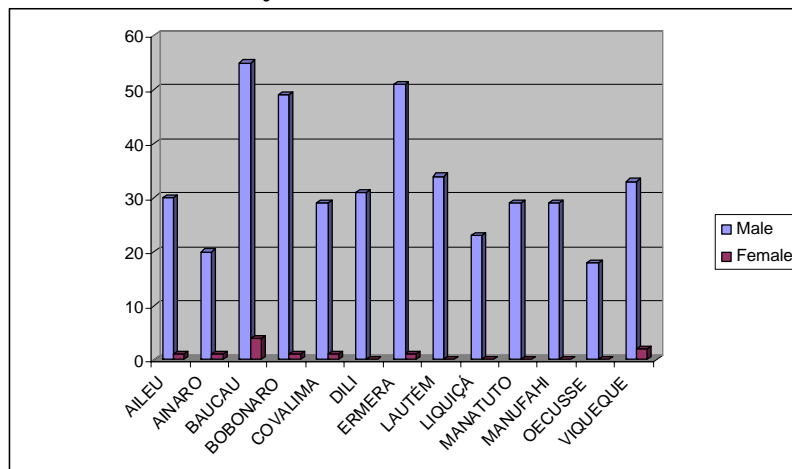

## Total Voters in Districts



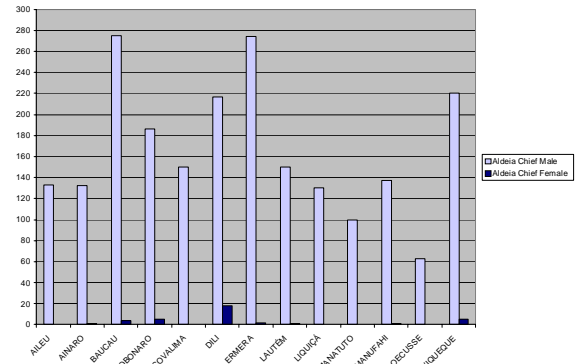

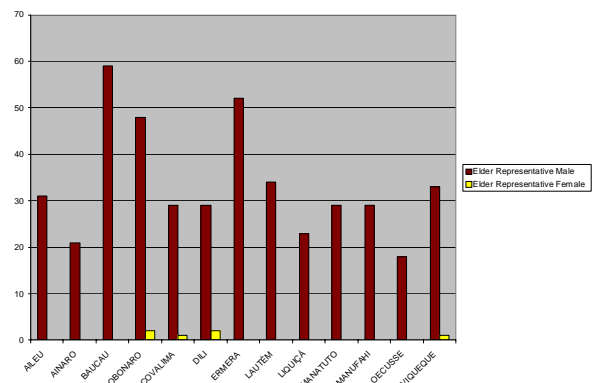
Results of the Aldeia Chiefs by Gender and Districts

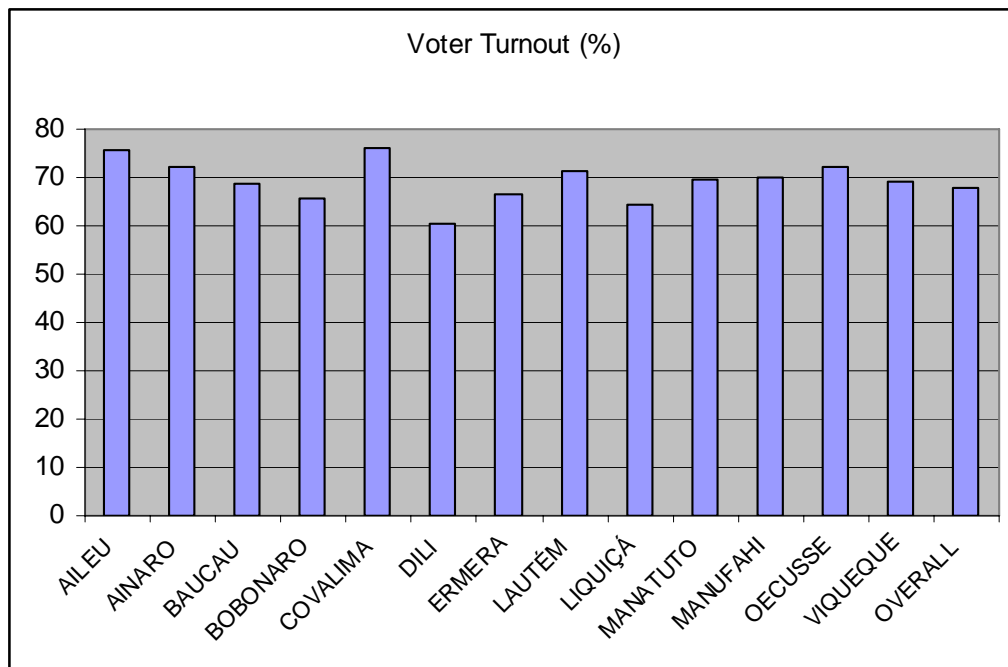

### **President Ramos Horta Visits CNE**

On 23 July the President of the Republic visited CNE HQ in order to meet with the CNE Commissioners, CNE staff and UNEST advisers to assess the institution's preparations towards next National Elections. The Chairman of the CNE Mr. Faustino Cardoso presented the main activities conducted by CNE during the first semester of 2010. In the meeting the CNE commissioners raised their main concerns, mainly regarding the limited funds that the CNE has to conduct their electoral activities. The President mentioned the possibility to mark the presidential elections in early 2012 (January) and not in April, as happened in 2007, in order to give enough time for the transition between Presidential periods. President Ramos Horta took the opportunity to thank the United Nations Electoral Support Team UNEST (UNDP-UNMIT) for the support provided to this institution and made an appeal to the donor community to continue supporting the UNDP Electoral Project financially.

### **RDTL Electoral Observation Mission to Japan**

A Timorese Delegation headed by the Director of STAE Tomás Cabral and with the participation of other Directors and Senior Officers from the Ministry of State Administration and Territorial Management went to Japan to observe the Upper House Elections that took place on 11 July 2010. This kind of visit gives them exposure to different ways of electoral organization and is a way to facilitate the exchange of information and gaining new ideas and exposure to good practices in electoral administration. The Observation Mission was supported by the Japanese Government and UNDP Timor-Leste.

### **UNDP GPECS Approves a Financial Contribution to the UNDP Support to the Timorese Electoral Cycle Project**

Elections are the cornerstone of democracy yet elections that reflect the will of the people depend on far more than how voting day is run. Their credibility depends on a complex interplay of electoral laws, rights, systems and institutions that transcend any one election event. In addition, as necessary as elections are, they alone are not sufficient for the consolidation of a society based on democratic principles and good governance. Democratic governance requires inclusive participation, responsive institutions and respect for human rights, equality, accountability and transparency. With this comprehensive picture in mind, and in response to a growing demand for its support, UNDP has established the Global Program for Electoral Cycle Support (GPECS). This program sets out a harmonized and process-driven, rather than event-driven, approach to electoral support. It helps ensure that developing countries receive the support they need while offering donors a single window through which to invest strategically in elections and in deepening democracy. GPECS is currently funded by Government of Spain and the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA). With the support of the Spanish Government and the Spanish Agency for International Cooperation and Development (AECID), in June 2010 GPECS has agreed to support the UNDP Support to the Timorese Electoral Cycle Project for the period 2010-2011. The financial contribution will help the UNDP Project to consolidate democracy in the country and accelerate human development in Timor-Leste particularly in the areas of women mainstreaming and strengthening the institutional capacity of the political parties in preparation of the upcoming electoral processes.

### **Commission for the Revision of the Electoral Laws**

The Minister of State Administration and Territorial Management, Arcângelo Leite, issued a Ministerial instruction to re-start the activities of the Commission for the Revision of the Electoral Laws. The Commission is chaired by the Secretary of State Florindo Pereira, and participate the Director of STAE, STAE staff and UNEST advisers. The objective of the Commission is to revise all the electoral legislation towards the 2012 elections and recommend changes and/or amendments when necessary. The Commission has started with the revision of the Law on the Parliamentary Elections. The main reason for this revision is due to some inconsistencies in the legal framework.

### **South-South Cooperation Mexico / STAE**

On 21 July the Ambassador of Mexico to Timor-Leste, Dr. Melba Pria, visited the Director of STAE Mr. Tomás Cabral as part of her periodical trip to Timor-Leste. The purpose of her visit was to evaluate the Mexican cooperation in the electoral area with STAE. The main activities developed in 2009 were: A Delegation of 5 members of STAE participated in a one week Electoral Workshop organized in Mexico City by the Mexican Electoral Management Body IFE on Municipal Electoral System in March 2009 and a Delegation from IFE Mexico participated in the Electoral Workshop organized in Dili by CNE and UNEST in November 2009. These activities have been conducted in coordination with UNEST as part of the South-South cooperation strategy. For the near future the activities planned are: the Mexican support in the electoral training program from STAE in coordination with INAP and the Mexican advice on the Community and Municipal Elections legislation.

### **UNEST Learning Sessions**

As part of the Learning Sessions organized by UNEST for its staff, Jessie Lagrosas, UNEST IT adviser to CNE, Olga Rabade, UNEST Legal adviser to CNE and Rodrigo Elias, IT adviser to STAE gave informative sessions in May and June. The first session “Philippines National and Local Elections”, given by Jessie Lagrosas, was based in his observations during the electoral observation mission in May for the Philippine's National and Local Elections. It was the first time that the Philippine's Commission on Elections' (COMELEC) implemented an Automated Election System (AES) in a nationwide scale. Jessie and the CNE commissioners observed the campaign period, the testing of the Precinct Count Optical Scan (PCOS) machines, the Election Day, and the tabulation and consolidation of results and presented his conclusions and issues raised. The session gave by Olga Rabade “Review of Legislation related to the setting of General Elections” focused on general elections (presidential and legislative) legal basis, the organs of sovereignty in Timor-Leste, the setting of these elections and issues needed to be taken in consideration for the convening of general elections. The session presented by Rodrigo Elias focused on the “Exhibition and Challenge process” for 2010. He explained the objectives, calendar, the public campaign implemented and a comparison between Registration Process and the Exhibition and Challenge Process.

### **After-Action Review 2010 Voter Registration Exercise**

On 06 July UNEST organized a retreat to discuss on the main concerns and the possible solution for the problems faced during the Voter Registration 2010 process. The participants were the CTA, Andres del Castillo; the Coordinator of the Electoral Advisers, Vera Monteiro; the advisers Raffaele Ditadi and Rodrigo Elias and all the Electoral UNV.

The participants discuss two main subjects: STAE Voter Registration 2010 results and the CNE Monitoring Process and Findings. After an all morning discussion the advisers announced the observations and recommendations based on the several reports written by the Electoral officers of both STAE and CNE. These were divided in 4 main areas: Voter Education, Voter Registration, Monitoring and Administrative, Logistics and Security.

The conclusions were presented to all UNEST members during the staff meeting, through a presentation conducted by Maria del Huerto Llorente and Sonia Rodrigues, the presentation was aimed to demonstrate the concerns and solutions suggested for the four areas discussed. The main recommendations include:

Voter Education area, it was recommended to utilize the Suco Chief to spread information among the population in the remote areas. Also, it was strongly suggested that a legal awareness campaign should be conducted in all districts with the relevant parties (STAE/CNE/PNTL/UNPOL, etc) in order to explain the legal framework involved in the Voter Registration process as well as the electoral offences existent in the penal code.

**Voter Registration area**, it was suggested to produce a manual including all the Voter Registration procedures as well the legal implications and the technical details of how to use the Data base system.

**Voters' roll,** it was suggested that an extra copy to be produced and sent to each Suco in order to allow STAE to place one in a public place and have the second copy as a safety place in case the original is damaged or stolen.

**Monitoring area,** the concerns were focused about the CNE lack of infrastructure, especially in the transportation and communication system, and was suggested that STAE and CNE should coordinate their activities and attempt to travel together or even utilize the commissioners' vehicles during the periods when activities are placed in the district. The final document with all the recommendations will be translated into Tetum and passed to the CNE and STAE authorities.
