INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this atlas is to complement existing information and assist organizations on the ground towards the planning of humanitarian and development activities in Timor-Leste by profiling the country's thirteen districts against selected indicators

Timor-Leste continues to face a number of complex and inter-linked issues that interface with the current internally displaced population issues (IDPs) but also touch on broader human insecurities. Timor-Leste is a young nation that faces chronic poverty and deeply rooted vulnerabilities in terms of natural disasters, high incidence of poverty, seasonal food insecurity, high unemployment, subsistence coping mechanisms, increasing Dili urbanization, high illiteracy, lack of economic opportunities and basic infrastructure, lack of a social safety net, gender-based violence, community disenfranchisement, lack of protection mechanisms, and insufficient institutional and budget execution capacity to implement interventions.

CONTENT

The atlas is divided into two sections. The first section seeks to spatially analyse different sector specific indicators to highlight districts in need. Selected services and infrastructures are also mapped per districts to reflect their spread across the country and stress the link between indicators and service provision.

The second section profiles each district, classified by alphabetical order, with classical geographical information, such as elevation, boundaries, rivers, etc., as well as practical information such as location of schools, health posts, helicopter landing zones (including those accessible during the rainy season), bridges, and UNPOL/PNTL stations, etc. Also included per district is a table including three types of data:

- Basic information (population, number of households, main language spoken, life expectancy, median age, mean age at first marriage, type of dwellings and dwelling ownership)
- Humanitarian indicators (flood rating, food insecurity rate, nutrition, water and sanitation, health.)
- Information on livelihoods (average number of livestock per households, employment per sector, number of households growing major crops.)


METHODOLOGY

The information included in this atlas, either for the mapping or to provide the basic indicators, was gathered from various sources:

- Information regarding health was collected from the World Health Organisation (WHO) and the Ministry of Health while education information was collected from UNICEF and the Ministry of Education
- Data on the police stations and posts was provided by UNPOL/PNTL through UNMIT
- The National Statistics Directorate and the GIS Portal currently updated by the Timor-Leste Geographic Information Group was a source of mapping files.
- Information on population was collected through the Timor-Leste Census of Population and Housing of 2004
- Humanitarian indicators were provided by FAO, WFP, OCHA, the 2004 Census and the Timor-Leste Survey of Living Standards which also provided dwelling information.
